February is going to see the 120th anniversary of Aerie #1 in our own backyard in North Seattle. We are honored that West Seattle #2643 has been asked to provide and schedule the entertainment to make the evening a celebration of community good cheer.

The anniversary of Aerie #1 reminds us of the reason we are all Eagles. Spending time together, planning, celebrating and even mourning together as a community. As our world goes global we are fortunate to know our neighbors and make the connections that make West Seattle our Aerie home.

A bit of history - The F.O.E. was founded on February 6, 1898. The organization was formed by six theater owners sitting on a pile of lumber in Moran's shipyard in Seattle Washington. They were competitors who had come together to discuss a musicians' strike. After deciding how to handle the strike, they agreed to "bury the hatchet" and form an organization dubbed "The Order of Good Things".

Early meetings were held on local theater stages, and, after taking care of business, attendees rolled out a keg of beer and enjoyed social time. As numbers grew, participants selected the bald eagle as the official emblem and changed the name to "The Fraternal Order of Eagles." In April 1898, the membership formed a Grand Aerie, secured a charter and developed a constitution and by-laws with John Cort elected the Eagles' first president.

Most early members were actors, stagehands and playwrights, who carried the Eagles story as they toured across the United States and Canada. The organization's success is also attributed to its funeral benefits (no Eagle was ever buried in a potter's field), the provision of an Aerie physician, among other membership benefits. The Eagles pushed for the founding of Mother's Day, provided the impetus for Social Security, and pushed to end job discrimination based on age. The Eagles have provided support for medical centers across the United States and Canada to build and provide research on medical conditions. Every year they raise millions of dollars to combat heart disease, diabetes and cancer. Also to help children with disabilities and uplift the aged and infirm.

Aerie #1, originally founded in the Act Theater Downtown where a gold Eagle stands proud as our birthplace, invites all of you to attend their anniversary celebration at their Lake City location on February 17th. The evening will start with a social hour from 4:00-5:30, followed by a performance by the Renton Spinnaker Drill Team. A buffet dinner will be served from 5:30-6:30. West Seattle Performing Arts will perform following dinner and anniversary ceremony. A live band "Solstice" will round out the evening from 7:00-11:00. Tickets will be \$20.

On another note our Heart Ball is being rescheduled to a later date as I work with Lori Hamilton, the State Auxiliary Max Baer Chairwoman on the details for this event. More information coming.

Congratulations on a successful District 5 meeting hosted by #2643 on January 20th. We had a great turnout and new friends were made and old friends reunited. A big thank you to Nate Kiem, District 5 Deputy and Mary Lou Wilkerson for contributions to the event.
