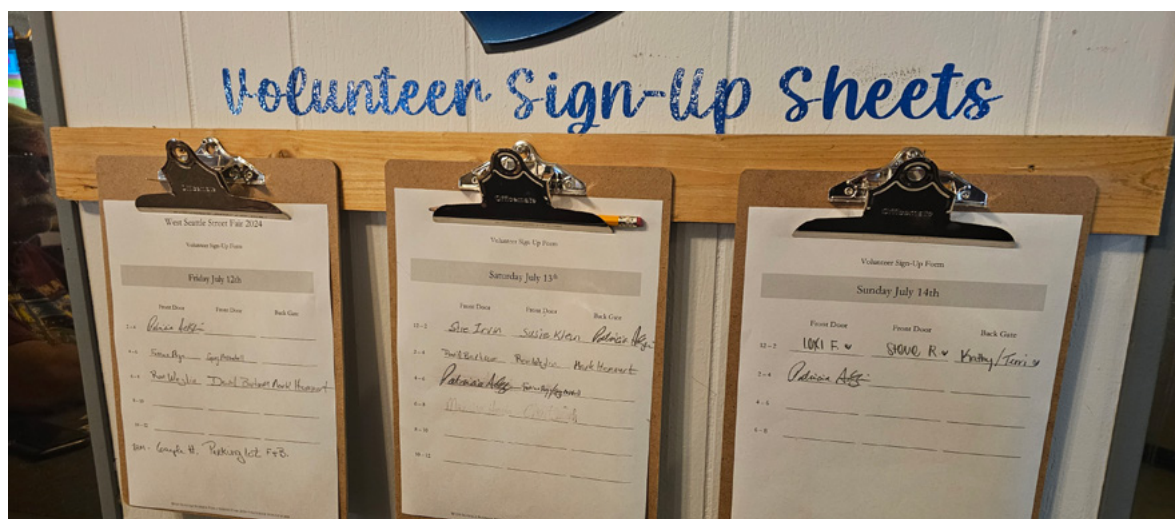
Vice Chair: Assists Chair /Co-chair in all matters.

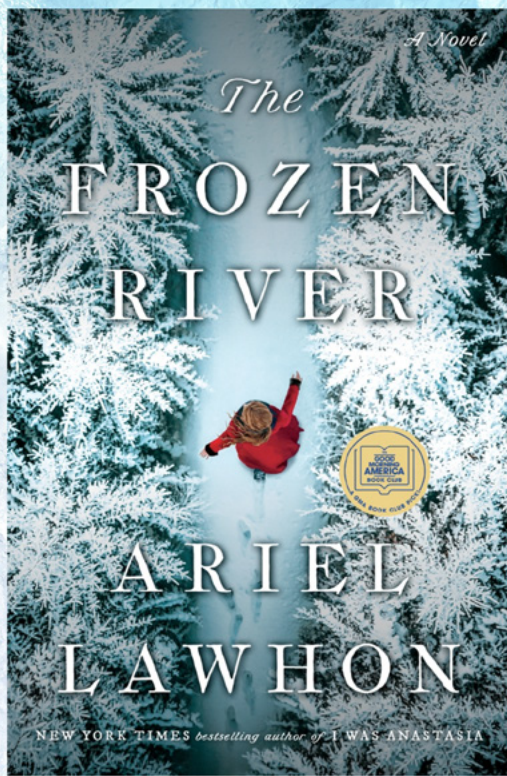
